India: Due to the coronavirus, Pastor David postponed the annual conference that was scheduled April 30 - May 3. However, they were able to complete more of the Conference Center construction before the lock-down order took effect. A temporary kitchen was built and hardware installed, allowing them to lock the buildings.



Emergency commodities are only available for purchase from 6 AM to 1 PM, and only three days per week in some districts. The prices have also been inflated, making it more difficult for the poor to survive. Faith In Action Ministries is working hard to provide for those at the greatest risk of starvation.

Tanzania: Much of Pastor Laban's time and resources are invested in caring for the 70 acres of cashews, which can provide valuable income for the ministry and pastors. They have a tractor that has a broken crank shaft and will cost at least \$2,000 to repair. The excavator is no longer in operating condition. However, the engine is good and Laban plans to use it to start a fabricating shop. He will hire some of the young men who have attended technical school and start a business of welding, manufacturing, recycling, and repairing farm equipment and other machinery to earn money for the ministry. He will dismantle and sell parts from the excavator to help start this new business venture and to help pay for the tractor repairs.



The church ministry is growing rapidly. In March, four New Harvest churches were birthed in Arusha district and one in Dar Es Salaam. The dispensary is also doing well.

The Mara region is a missionary focus of NHMT. There are currently 13 NHMT churches in the area. Strong winds and heavy rains caused the new roof of this church to collapse in March. They need only \$1,200 to repair.




Tanzania cont'd: Pastor Laban writes that Tanzania has had 254 reported coronavirus cases. Two of the cities reporting new cases are 150 miles from Mpanda, where his church and ministry are located. Church services are still being held but schools and colleges will be closed until further notice.
